



The University of Central Florida offers the Boyd Lyon Memorial Fellowship to a highly qualified doctoral student admitted to the Conservation Biology PhD program. Stipend payments begin in the Fall semester.

Duration of Award:

Maximum of two years of support.

Fellowship Stipend:

\$18,000 per year for up to two years.

Tuition Support:

UCF College of Graduate Studies pays the charges for degree program courses during each year of the award. The student is responsible for the payment of local fees (health fee, athletic fee, building fee, etc.).

Health Insurance:

A UCF Student Health Insurance Policy through UnitedHealthcare and serviced by Gallagher Student Health & Special Risk will be provided for your individual coverage for the duration of the award.

Criteria for Fellowship Selection:

- Submission of a completed admission application and all test scores (including TOEFL for international students) by January 15.
- Admission to the Conservation Biology PhD program.
- Evidence of awards, recognition, or honors.
- A strong commitment to conservation biology, particularly turtle research.

Fellowship Description:

- UCF College of Graduate Studies provides an \$18,000 (\$9,000 fall and \$9,000 spring) fellowship per year for two years.

Fellowship Obligations:

- Maintain good academic standing and acceptable progress to degree.
- Participate in UCF fellowship community activities.
- Maintain full-time enrollment in the Conservation Biology PhD program (9 credit hours are required during the fall and spring terms). Summer enrollment is optional - fellowship recipients receive tuition support for 6 credit hours during the summer terms.
